Ms Lim was first elected to the Parliament of Singapore in 1996 and served till 2011, last as a Minister in the Prime Minister's Office, and concurrently Second Minister for Finance and for Transport.

She is the first woman to serve in Singapore's Cabinet.

In Finance, Ms Lim spearheaded a reform of accountancy sector, reviewed Government's investments in business, and helped implement financing options for small and medium enterprises. In Transport, she corporatized Changi Airport, helped establish a master-plan for aviation and was instrumental in expanding the International Maritime Centre.

Currently, Ms Lim is an executive director at Tembusu Partners, a senior advisor to Kohlberg Kravis & Roberts, a member of the Asia advisory board of Westpac Institutional Bank, an independent nonexecutive director of Jardine Cycle & Carriage Ltd., United Overseas Bank and BW Group, and honorary chairman of Securities Investors Association, Singapore. Between 2011 and 2014, she served as an independent nonexecutive representative of the Ernst & Young global advisory council.

Ms Lim has graduated from Cambridge and UCLA Anderson School of Management.
